How to find Us:

From the Pickering - Whitby Road (A169)

After descending Blue Bank head straight on through the village of Sleights. Pass over the railway / River Esk Bridge at the bottom of the valley and then turn immediately right onto the B1410 to Ruswarp.

Pass through the traffic calming and after 300 yards turn left at the Chapel heading up the hill on Carr Hill Lane. After passing the turn for Brook Park on the left we are the fourth driveway on the left hand side through a wooded area.

On the left you should pass a wooden garage on a gravel track. The driveway to the house is on the left up the hill.

From the Whitby - Guisborough Road (A171)

At the roundabout turn onto the Sleights and Pickering Road (A169). 800 yards on take a left turn onto Carr Hill Lane. Follow the road down the hill passing Carr Hill Ridge on the right and Ridge Lane on the Left.

Descend another 600 yards passing a Cul-de-sac on the left by a large Beech hedge. Turn immediately right between the trees.

On the left you should pass a wooden garage on a gravel track. The driveway to the house is on the left up the hill.

Marwood

Marwood is a Yorkshire Stone house, built on the south facing slopes of the Esk valley. Surrounded by mature trees and a large sloping garden amidst woodland and fields, the house is in a quiet location on the edge of the North Yorkshire Moors National Park, yet is only 2 miles from Whitby itself.

The accommodation hosts 2 Double rooms with en-suite shower facilities and their own access.

Things to Do

Whitby has a rich heritage of Celtic saints and the ruins of the 13th Century abbey dominate the town's skyline.

A host of museums offer a wide ranging history of the past exploits of Whitby and its seafarers.

Just down the coast, Ravenscar hosts the *Heritage Coast Visitors Centre*. The area is renowned for fossil bearing rocks such as ammonites and black jet jewellery made famous by Queen Victoria.

Whitby is the town where Dracula landed in Bram Stoker's novel and more recently is the location for G.P. Taylor's best selling Shadowmancer books. The town makes regular appearances in the *Yorkshire TV series Heartbeat* - with nearby Goathland starring as village of *Adensfield*. Goathland and is also served by the North Yorkshire Moors Railway. Steam trains run throughout the year and are very popular with visitors, especially since the railway's appearance as Hogsmeade Station in the *Harry Potter* film series.

Special services also run during summer months on the Esk Valley line between Glaisdale and Whitby.

The North Yorkshire Moors are a walker's paradise with over 1000 miles of footpaths and bridleways. The *Moors Centre* is the best place to begin your visit, located further up the Esk Valley at Danby.

Nearby Ruswarp offers its own miniature railway, rowing boats on the river Esk, golf course, and day fishing permits.

Travel

Esk Valley Railway

Often called the most scenic line in Britain, the Esk Valley railway calls at all local villages from Whitby through to Middlesbrough, including Grosmost at the head of the North Yorkshire Moors Railway. Sleights station, two stops from Whitby is located just down the hill from Marwood.

North Yorkshire Moors Railway

At 18 miles it's the longest steam railway in the UK. Passing through spectacular scenery it's not just for rail enthusiasts. Ideal for walkers who want to see more remote areas or for visiting Goathland and Pickering. Steam services are now running via the Esk Valley line into Whitby. Check the latest timetable for details.
